Chris will preach and attend the Annual Church Picnic on Sunday, June 1st. On Monday, June 2nd the sabbatical will begin, concluding on Tuesday, September 2nd, when he will return to the pulpit and begin a new sermon series, "Tell Me the Stories of Jesus."


How can we pray for the Lenhart family during this time?

- · Rest as they disengage from ministry activities.
- · Renewal and refreshment as a family.
- Safe travel and special memories created on trips and vacations.
- Quiet moments of personal study for spiritual formation.
- Windows of time and moments of clarity for writing, creativity, and the development of new brainstorms and fresh ideas for future ministry.

Here are some general plans being made for Chris's sabbatical:

- Personal spiritual growth and formation, extended times of study, prayer, and writing.
- Growing as a more patient and understanding husband and father.
- · Running and working out.
- Availability to children as they are preparing for major life transitions.
- Spending time visiting with family and friends we rarely see.
- Monthly connections with Ken Walton for accountability of the intended use of sabbatical.
- Visiting a house church located in downtown Manhattan.
- A trip to Washington DC, just Sheila and I. Bible Museum and Ben Rector concert!
- Many other small trips, events, and good times with family and friends.





What is a sabbatical?

Put simply, it's a rest. In Scripture, Sabbath days were days of rest, and Sabbath years were years when the land rested. A personal sabbatical is a common practice in certain education settings, with teachers/professors taking a yearlong sabbatical periodically for rest, travel, and study.

Why are sabbaticals important for pastors?

While being a pastor is very rewarding, it is also an emotionally and spiritually demanding vocation. Pastor burn-out is common and causes many pastors to leave the ministry. Many churches and ministries have discovered the value of granting pastors' periodic times for rest, refreshment, and renewal. Following the pattern of scripture, sabbaticals are often encouraged every seven years. The CMBC policies and procedures for Pastoral staff make provisions for full-time pastors at CMBC to take an occasional sabbatical. Chris is completing his seventh year of ministry at CMBC and therefore meets the criteria for a ministry sabbatical. This will be Chris's first ministry sabbatical in over 20 years of Pastoral ministry.

Is something wrong or falling apart that Chris needs a sabbatical?

No. On the contrary, Pastor Chris and the elders agree that CMBC is at a healthy place, and the timing is just right for a sabbatical. Rather than fixing something that is falling apart or broken, we believe that this mode of proactive care for our pastors is essential for maintaining long-term ministry stability and promoting ministry longevity.

What will Chris do during sabbatical?

The main objectives are to disconnect from pastoral activities, revive the soul, recreate in healthy ways, and spend extra time with family. Chris will intentionally measure his sabbatical into four quarters. Each quarter will be aimed at refreshing an area of his personal life and ministry.

One quarter will be directed toward his personal spiritual formation. The second quarter will be aimed at strengthening and cultivating his relationship with Sheila. A third quarter will be directed toward his role as a father. Then, the final quarter before he returns to CMBC will be set aside for ministry development.

The Lenhart family will take a few trips and enjoy some recreational activities as well.

Ken Walton and Pastor Jared Schnapf, spiritual friends and mentors to Chris for many years, will serve as Sabbatical Coaches. Ken will meet monthly with Chris during the sabbatical for support and accountability.

Does Pastor Chris still receive his normal salary while on sabbatical?

In keeping with standard sabbatical practices, and for Chris to be free to rest and disconnect, his full salary will continue throughout the sabbatical.

Who will fill Pastor Chris's roles while he is away?

CMBC is thankful to have Pastor Jim on board as well as a strong Elder Team capable of carrying the leadership load. We will also rely on the ministry experience of Pastors Bob Reid and Tom Hubbard while Pastor Chris is away.

Our Elders will continue to oversee and guide the ministries of CMBC, and a preaching schedule has been developed with guest pastors, ministry leaders, and teachers lined up to fill pulpit and teach Berean ABF.

Pastoral Care & Visitation: Pastor Jim and Pastors Bob Reid and Tom Hubbard, along with our visitation team, will be available for pastoral care, funerals, hospital visitation, and other pastoral services as needed or required. Pastor Chris will be unavailable for these care opportunities for the duration of his sabbatical.

Who will be preaching on Sunday mornings and what will we be reflecting on?

Our list of speakers will include the following: Pastors Bob Reid, Tom Hubbard, Jim Davis, and John Desiderio (son-in-law of Dave & Dolly Fisher), will share summer pulpit time along with ministry leaders Matt Whitacre, Josiah Reimold, and Paul Golden (with FOI). Topics will include: "Life with God," several weeks exploring the character of God; "Life in Christ," several weeks examining the person and work of Jesus; And finally, "Life by the Spirit;" several weeks considering the role of the Holy Spirit in our lives.

Will Chris and Sheila still come to CMBC activities during the sabbatical?

No. It is necessary for Chris and Sheila to disconnect from CMBC completely for the sabbatical.

Can we still contact them with quick questions or just to say hello?

Sorry, but no. We're asking that you do not initiate contact with Chris and Sheila over the summer. However, if you see them at the store, you don't need to run the other way! Greet them, but please respect the sabbatical disconnect by trying not to talk about matters of the church.
